

Recognition of Student Achievement

The school encourages excellence and acknowledges student achievements at three levels: a) in class settings b) on Learning Community assemblies c) on Whole School assemblies.

Formal recognition for outstanding achievements is acknowledged at an Annual Awards Night held in Term 4.

CRITERIA FOR SPORTS AWARDS

Sports Awards recognise achievement in QSS sanctioned events. Students are recognised for sporting achievements whilst enrolled at Bribie Island SHS.

The following points system is used to determine Sports Awards, including Sportsman of the Year, Sportswoman of the Year and Junior Sportsperson of the Year.

Carnivals – The school conducts 4 sports carnivals throughout the year. Performances in each of these carnivals are used to determine Age Champions and Runners-Up in each division.

Even points at the end of the season

In the case of a draw, to separate students the following will apply:

Student with the highest level of representation in a sport will be awarded the winner. If still even, the student with the broadest number of sports represented in will be awarded the winner.

Representative Sport - Throughout the year, students are given the opportunity to trial for selection in a range of sports. Points are awarded when students compete at district, regional, state and national teams as follows:

(Points are awarded only for the highest level of representation in a particular sport.)

RECORD KEEPING

An updated list of current points will be published at the end of each term by the Director of Sport.

The school endeavours to keep accurate records of student achievement in school sport. However, it is a student's responsibility to check the points list and inform the Director of Sport of any errors or omissions.

Bronze, Silver and Gold Sports Awards are distributed at the Annual Awards Night. The minimum criterion for each award is:

Sportsperson of the year generally has represented to a regional level.

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ACADEMIC AWARDS

Academic Awards are assigned to the top 10% of students at each year level. The Awards are calculated following End of Semester One reporting. Senior Academic Awards are based on the R6 verification process. No nomination is required for these awards.

A Dux award is awarded to the top student in every year level, with the School Dux being awarded to the top student in Year 12. Dux will be calculated using all/some of the following:

- ➔ GPA in QCAA Authority Subjects
- ➔ R6 subject rankings
- ➔ QCS subject means from the previous year

A subject award is presented to the top student in each Year 12 subject.

Culture/Service awards are presented to students who nominate and can prove their level of involvement to the required standard.

Where students are required to nominate for awards, a selection panel of three staff who represent the faculty or co-curricular area of involvement make the final decision as to the winner and ensure all the selection criteria are met. Students must nominate.

The top 15% of students in each year level (based on GPA) receive Academic Awards.

CRITERIA FOR GRADUATION AND FORMAL ATTENDANCE BY SENIOR STUDENTS

Graduation and Formal are non-compulsory (enrichment) activities organised by the school as a celebration and recognition of successfully completing secondary schooling. Attendance at Graduation and Formal is by Principal invitation only. The following criteria are considered prior to invitations being issued:

- ➔ All assessment completed and submitted;
- ➔ Regular attendance at school, with all absences and lateness explained and evidenced.
- ➔ Satisfactory behaviour record. Students who have suspensions on their record will need to apply to the Principal.
- ➔ All resources are returned to the school as part of the clearance process;
- ➔ Dress code followed.

As these are enrichment activities a parent who has joined the Student and Resource Scheme is expected to have fully paid the SRS fee or have negotiated a payment plan with the Principal/ Finance Team.
